Supporting you on your FAIR-enabling journey

The availability of data that are findable, accessible, interoperable and reusable (FAIR) lies at the heart of the European Open Science Cloud (EOSC) vision. FAIR is not a binary concept and cannot be achieved by any single action or actor. Instead, FAIR is a shared journey involving several stakeholders over the entire research lifecycle.



Researchers play a key role in making their outputs FAIR. The organisations who employ them, the funding bodies that financially support and influence the way they work, the research support staff who assist them, and the range of infrastructures used to create, share and curate their outputs also play critical roles. To help foster a FAIR ecosystem, FAIR-IMPACT will support three key stakeholder groups **research performing organisations**, **repositories and data services providers**, and **national level initiatives** - to begin or progress their FAIR-enabling journeys. Through our series of open calls, FAIR-IMPACT raises awareness and supports the uptake of existing and emerging tools, solutions and approaches that have been developed through recently completed and ongoing European Commission INFRAEOSC projects and international initiatives such as the Research Data Alliance.

- 3. take the next step in implementing FAIR-enabling practices.

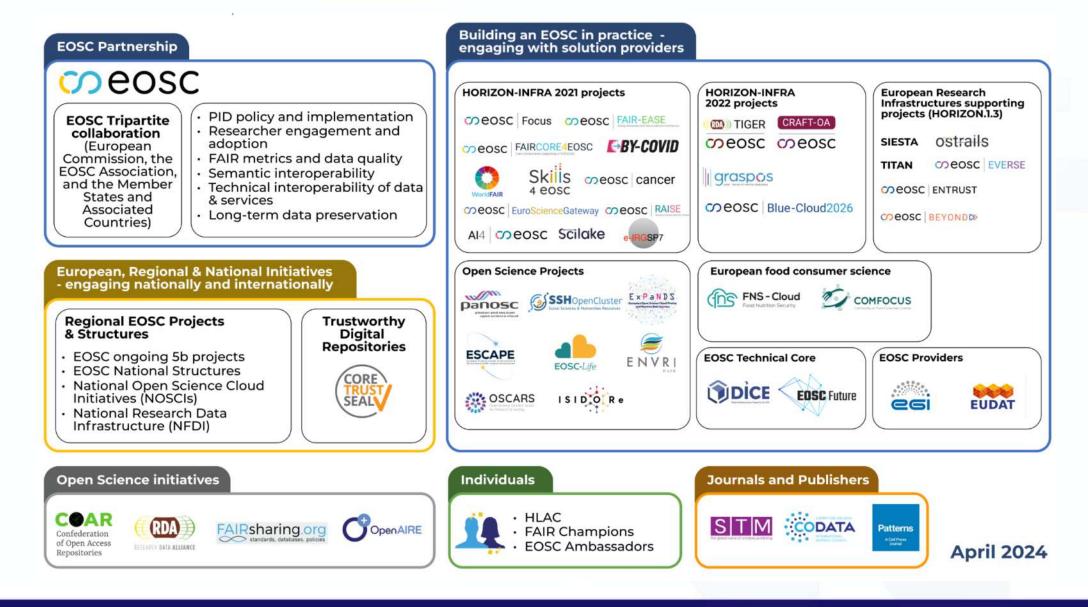

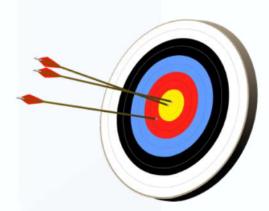


